Following the relaxation of Government COVID-19 restrictions on the opening of places of worship, Rivington Chapel is now open for private prayer and contemplation on Wednesday evenings from 7 to 8 p.m.

We are considering the guidance on the reopening of places of worship for services before making a decision about what to do at Rivington Chapel.

Here is the seventh of the news sheets that we will continue to produce to coincide with our usual service dates.

Our on-line services

Vince took the service on Sunday 5 July, following the previous week's theme of 'Hope' with 'Faith'. There were tributes to Renaissance theologians, Michael Servetus (Miguel Servet) from Spain and Faustus Socinus (Fausto Sozzini) from Italy. Readings included a piece by Arthur Stewart on the importance of hymns as an expression of faith, and the thoughts of Kahlil Gibran on Religion. John Readett played us a recording of Turnpike Band singing 'The World Turned Upside Down', a song by Leon Rosselson about the 17th century Diggers movement.

The collaborative meeting on Sunday 12 July featured contributions on the subject of 'Charity', thus completing the often associated threesome. There was an article from the Inquirer by Bob Janis-Dillon entitled 'What have you done for your neighbour?' and a poem called 'Earth's Charm' which Tina Booth had written and sent in. John Readett sang Pete Seeger's version of 'Turn, Turn, Turn', and Paul played the tune 'Smile' which was written by Charlie Chaplin.

Lynne Readett will be leading the service on Sunday 19 July and we will have another collaborative meeting on Sunday 26 July. If you have any suggestions for themes or contributions, please let us know.
