#### **Chairman's Letter**

The Congregational AGM (see the notice above) will be held on Sunday 16 March, and we'll be holding elections for Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and general Committee Members. If you'd be interested in joining the Committee, please let us know.

The 2025 General Assembly Annual Meetings will be held at Birmingham Hilton Metropole Hotel near the NEC. They will run from Saturday 12 April to Monday 14 April. The reason for holding the meetings at the weekend is to make it easier for people who are working during the week to attend. I'm intending to go and am happy to be the Chapel's delegate if the Congregation agrees. However, it would be great if some other Rivington members were able to go. There's a special reduced rate (£150, which is less than half the standard rate) for anyone attending for the first time. This covers 2 nights' accommodation and all meals. The flower rota has been updated, so please check it on the notice board in Chapel. If for any reason you are unable to provide the flowers when it's your turn, please let me know as soon as possible so that alternative arrangements can be made.

Since September I've been attending the monthly online Administrator's Network meetings hosted by Lizzie Kingston Harrison, the GA Congregational Connections lead and Jenni Duffell, Church Administrator at Shrewsbury. It's been interesting to find out about some of the issues facing other Unitarian Chapels, how they are similar to or (particularly in the case of churches in urban centres) different from our experiences at Rivington. There's always a useful exchange of in-

formation, and I've been made aware of matters that we need to look into, such as making sure we keep to the rules regarding copyright and some of the implications of holding events in the Chapel.

Horwich Heritage Centre have recently been given various books and documents by the family of Martin Brownlow and they have passed on those that are relevant to the Chapel. There are several books from the late 18<sup>th</sup> and the 19<sup>th</sup> century that were once in the Sunday School Library, plus the library register showing who borrowed books between 1865 and 1961. Among the documents are several pew rent records and copies of bills for work done at the Chapel. I'm in the process of making a full list before we make a decision about where they should be kept.

#### **Trustees Matters**

As stated in my previous Newsletter report, our new secretary, Mr John Winstanley has been in post and serviced the September Trustees' meeting as well as reviewing the General and Fire Risk Assessments, tasks which are always undertaken by early December of each year. During his appointment, John was enthusiastic about using the Chapel as a venue for a number of events which would publicise the Chapel as well as provide income from any profits made. The first of these was a highly successful book signing by the author and actor from the Yorkshire Vet TV series, Matt Smith. The event on 12 December attracted over 50 paying attenders, the majority of whom purchased a signed copy of his book entitled *My Life as a Yorkshire Vet*. We hope that this may pave the way for other events during 2025.

Regarding our investments, our Investment Treasurer, Chris Haighton, has now overseen the transfer of all these funds to a new investment platform which the Trustees and their financial advisor consider more appropriate to a charity such as the Chapel.

The work on the Columbarium wall extension at the north side of the Garden of Remembrance is now complete, almost within our projected budget of £16,000. The details of how niches are to be allocated, at what costs and for what periods of time are currently being discussed with the aim of finalising the conditions in time for the AGM and Trustees' meeting in March.

One last action for the year was the successful felling of the beech tree on 17<sup>th</sup> December. This was the tree that shed a large branch in July 2023 with a second branch falling in August of the same year. Apart from a smashed horizontal gravestone, no major damage was done, but our tree doctor, Andy Wing, considered the tree to be a danger. This enabled us to receive a grant from The Manchester District Association for half the costs, for which the Trustees are extremely grateful.

We have been advised to consider bringing forward our next Quinquennial Review into 2025 as doing so will mean that this can be organised by the MDA and full costs borne by them and the Hibbert Trust.
