# Lay Person in Charge's Letter

This has been a month of contrasts, a time of quiet and a time of intense activity and all with a background of radiant blue skies. I cannot remember an April like it; in fact, our Chapel Facebook page is festooned with blue sky pictures of Chapel from virtually every angle.

On 1 April, we held the funeral of Dr Frank Yates, a long-time trustee of the Chapel, who, sadly, has passed away aged 91. He and his wife Doris had moved to Scarborough to be near their daughter Ruth some years ago, but Frank's express wish was to have his funeral in Rivington and for his ashes to be kept in our columbarium. A man of many talents who looked after the health of many in Adlington, Rivington, Anderton and Heath Charnock, it is no wonder he was so well known and that his funeral was so very well attended. Dr Yates' popularity was due in no small part to his hands-on approach; he part-managed the building of Granville Street surgery and delivered many of the babies in the village.

At a time when many of our Chapels and Churches, even in well populated areas, are struggling to maintain numbers, we seem to be holding up OK. Chris Martin and Geoff Newey's opening of Chapel for two hours at 1pm on each 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday afternoon is bringing a welcome footfall in Chapel. Our new columbarium extension is also bringing a renewed community focus for the Chapel, thanks in no small part to the ministrations of Debbie Atkins and Paul Fairclough.

How we connect with the community is all important to the longevity of our Chapel and our Unitarian ethos of inclusion. Being at the centre of our village Spring Festival on Saturday 10 May (11am-4pm) is another way of keeping us in focus and helps no-end in raising funds for local good causes and charities.

Our Congregational Chairman Alison Whitaker, Judith Crompton and myself all attended the GA Meetings, held this year in Birmingham, and we paraded our Chapel banner most proudly. As part of the proceedings I was accepted onto the General Assembly (GA) Lay Leaders Register, having successfully completed the 'Advanced Worship Leadership Course', which training is invaluable in supporting communities such as ours.

While at the GA Meetings you get to see our church in the wider world, the bigger picture, so to speak. One of the sessions I attended was the 'Facilitators Network' run by Jane Blackall and Lizzie Kingston -Harrison. In this it was explained to us that 'Nurturing small groups as spaces for connection, sharing, self-reflection and solidarity is an increasingly essential part of the work we do as a movement'. Having joined this group I, or we, will be able to call upon the experience gained by others who have years of know-how in creating strong *'engagement groups'*. I was thinking of perhaps starting an art group where participants could meet and mix with varying degrees of social contact, but it's early doors yet and much to learn first.

I wish everybody a happy Easter and joyously sunny summer season.

There have been some recent changes to the pulpit rota, which means that Sunday 15 June has become free. So, this will now be a service featuring contributions from the Congregation. If you have a suggestion for a theme, hymns, readings or music please let me know as soon as possible so that we can start to plan.

## **AGM Report**

The officers were re-elected unopposed: Chairman - Alison Whitaker, Treasurer - Frank Ascroft. Olive Fisher was officially elected to the Committee following her co-option during the year, and joins Diane Fairclough, Paul Fairclough and Geoff Newey.

Vince was re-elected as Lay Person in Charge.

It was decided to bring the AGM in 2026 forward to the first Sunday in March to avoid a clash with Mothering Sunday. It will be held on Sunday 1 March.

The draft minutes have been circulated by email and there is a copy on the notice board in Chapel together with the statement of accounts. They will also be available on the Chapel website (www.rivingtonchapel.org.uk).

#### Trustees Matters

At the March AGM, the Annual Report for 2024 was presented to the meeting and accepted with the year showing a significant improvement of income over expenditure as well as an increase in the value of our investments. Both these figures were influenced by the gift of £30,000 earlier in the year from the Bank Street Chapel Trustees. This was in spite of incurring the cost of building the now completed columbarium extension for approximately £16,000. Already three niches have been sold under the new conditions of limited tenure (15 years) at £1500 per niche. There are projects in hand to improve the character of the Garden of Remembrance, including gentle cleaning of the original columbarium stonework, flagstone cleaning and the creation of a pathway around the new extension.

Before the AGM, our stalwart Trustee of many years, Olive Fisher, tendered her resignation, although as an active member of the Congregation she continues as valued member of the Congregational Committee. On behalf of the Trustees, I presented her with a gift at the Chapel service on Sunday 6 April as a token of their thanks for her contribution.

The Trustees, working through the Secretary and Natashia Stanley at the MDA, have commissioned a digital survey of the upper vestry and Chapel to assist with any future works. With regard to the vestry, the plausibility of replacing the staircase with one more easily accessible plus the building of an internal toilet is under investigation using the MDA architect. Once this is undertaken, then appropriate costings may be obtained. However, before any work may be carried out, a 'Heritage Statement' will have to be produced and this too is being pursued with the help of the MDA. Because of these plans, the Trustees have been advised to restore the next Quinquennial Review back to 2026, with full costs being borne by the MDA and the Hibbert Trust.

Finally, in order to improve access for wheelchair users, the Trustees have agreed to purchase a portable ramp within the near future and definitely before a service that will be presented by two guest speakers, one of whom is a wheelchair user.
