RIVINGTON CHAPEL.

EXTRACT from Trust deed dated 2nd Feby, 1779.

UPON TRUST to pay apply and dispose of the interest and ----produce of the said principal monies unto and for such intents ---and purposes as they the said Trustees and the survivors and ----survivor of them or their successors or the greater number of them for the time being shall in their discretion think fit that is ---to say either for the promotion of the Christian faith, Protestant Religion and Holiness x x x x x x x x x in and amongst the inhabitants and persons and their children inhabiting and being or that shall -hereafter from time to time inhabit and be in the said towns or --hamlets of Rivington etc., for their spiritual good and comfort orotherwise for the promoting the temporal benefit and profit and --advantage of them some or any of them in such ways and by such ---methods and means public or private as they the said Trustees and the survivors or survivor of them etc., in their discretion think meetand from time to time determine of or deem expedient so as the same Trustees and the survivors etc., shall at all times be and shall be sole and absolute arbitrary judges electors etc., both of the usesand ends intents and purposes aforesaid and also the ways and means conducing thereunto.

The above relates to the Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway Stock.

The Chief rents are held under an Indenture dated 21 January.1887 and the income has to be applied "in or towards the maintenance
and also if necessary on the repairs and improvements of the said-Chapel Building and of the graveyard attached thereto".

The Midland Railway Stock is held under a Deed of Trust dated 12 January 1906 "Upon trust to pay the annual interest and income thereof to the Minister for the time being of the Chapel and if and while there shall be no such Minister Upon Trust to apply the same for or towards the maintenance of the person or persons occupying the pulpit during such period or periods as there shall be no such Ministers.
