the same John Worlsey Thomas Bromiley of Marples in the said County Chapman and Robert Anderson son & heire apparente of Thomas Anderson of Cromwell aforesaid
of late bages of buildinge is lately quicke & built by severall protestants dissenting from the church of England upon certaine plotte or pell of grounde lately recovered & inclosed of a large close of grounde situate and lynd
in Armiton aforesaid containinge seueral houses in length and forty in breadth therabouts being the Inuertant of the said John Anderson to boord place for religiouse Worshipe only and for all assembly & meetinge of
dicular church or congregation of protestants dissenting from the Church of England for the free exercize of theyr divine Worshipe therin and that the said and said Minister and Minister or Ministers or laymen
congregation shall bee & protestant Minister or Ministers of the congersation from the Church of England but quicke & accordinge to an act of Parliament made in the first yare of the reigne of our last kyng
Lord and Lady William and Mary of England & King and Queen Intituled an act for Extinctinge their Majestys protestant subjects dissenting from the Church of England from the Conquerour to them selfes or that shall bee
qualified accordinge to some other act of Parlliam^t or Law that shall how after bee made and constitutinge favour and allowance of sume dissenting protestants This Indenture sheweth or witnesseth that
for the promisnge and better carryinge on the purpose and designe hereof as in Consideration of the sume of fiftie shillings or the full mony of England to him the said John Andrewe in hand paid by
him the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley Thomas Waddington Alexander Waddington John Brownlowe Richard Brownlowe James Worlsey John Dale John Morris
Thomas Bromiley and Robert Anderson dñe every of thye thirteyn and every of thye exer^t and dominis for ever by thye thirteyn and also for and in Consideration of the yearly rent of two poneys of ge
Lassfull mony of England hereafter made by thye thirteyn resorve to the said John Andrewe and his heires and for diversitie of thyre good caues and valuable goods arond him the said John Andrewe shall unto
especiall myng^t H^t C^t given granted bargained and sold thye thirteyn dñe for hymself and his heires clearely and absolutely gre^t grant bargain
and aliene infushe and confirme unto the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley Thomas Waddington Alexander Waddington John Brownlowe Richard Brownlowe James Worlsey John Dale John Morris
Thomas Bromiley and Robert Anderson and to thye heires and assignes for ever all the said boord place of grounde lately enclosed as aforesayd and all the chappell oratory buildynge and buildings thereto
standinge and boing^t in or upon the same to gether with all wayes waters watercourses hedges dykes fencys easementes profit commodities hereditarie and appurtenis whiche ever unto the said boord
enclosed plotte of grounde and þmbo^r belongings or appurtenis or that have beeene thereto and enjoyed together with the same since the makinge thereof And also all the estate righte interest
in thye proprie clarkes and demayns whatsoev^r of hym the said John Andrewe in and unto al and singuler the þmbo^r To have and to hold the said plotte or pell of grounde and all and singuler
other the þmbo^r whatsoev^r from before mentioned or intended to bee honory granted and conveyed with thye and every of thye appurtenis unto the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley

intents and purposes only heron after expysed and declared (viz.) In the first place upon this speciall trust and confidencie that thoy the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley Thomas
Waddington Alexander Waddington John Brownlowe Richard Brownlowe James Worlsey John Dale John Morris Thomas Bromiley and Robert Anderson and the survivors and survivor of thym and
thirteyn shall and will pmitte and suffer the said Chappell or oratory to bee used and employed for the exercize of divine worshipe therin and by sume of congregacion and assembly of protestants
in thirteyn shall and will pmitte and suffer the said Chappell or oratory to bee used and employed for the exercize of divine worshipe therin and by sume of congregacion and assembly of protestants
only as shall bee dissenting from the Church of England a dñe and durynge so longe tyme as thye lawes of this Realme will permitte And if thye lawes of this Realme will not permitte the same
maner and forme aforesaid that then and in such case thoy the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley Thomas Waddington Alexander Waddington John Brownlowe Richard Brownlowe James
Worlsey John Dale John Morris Thomas Bromiley and Robert Anderson and the survivors and survivor of thym and thye heires shall and may as thoy think fitt employ the said plotte or pell of
grounde and the said chappell buildinge & minister aforesayd or conveyed Or shall truly fauifully and, whiche distribute conuent & boordow all sume yearly governour profits and commodities as thye
shall make of the same þmbo^r if any profit shall bee by thym made therough in such deuise and works of charite & piety as thye the said trustees heire in before named or the major pte of thym and
of thye said trustees shall in thye discretion think most fitt but with the consent approbation and allowance of the said John Andrewe and not otherwise duringe the termes of his naturall life. Deed
inge and payng^t þt forto unto the said John Andrewe and his heires the annuall and yearly Rent of two poneys at the feare of the nativity of S^t yohn Baptist wher and so often as the same
shall bee behinde & unpaid and that an actuall demand shall bee made therough by the said John Andrewe and his heires and not otherwise And it is hereby declared covenanted and agreed by and
betweene the þt to those þt that when and set often and from time to time and att all times hereafter continually or foyre of the grantees or trustees concerning the þt shall happen to due that
then the survivinge grantee or trustee shall convey over all and singuler the þt herin before mentioned and intended to bee honory granted or conveyed to foyre or more other trustees or
grantees and thye heires to the use of thymselfes and the said foyre or more other grantees or trustees and thye heires yet notwithstanding upon the severall and respective and to and for the picular
use entys and purposes only herin before expysed and declared and to none other ent or purpose whatsoev^r And the said John Andrewe for himself his heires exer^t and dominis both covenant
promise and grant to and with the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley Thomas Waddington Alexander Waddington John Brownlowe Richard Brownlowe James Worlsey John Dale John Morris Thomas Bromiley and
Robert Anderson and with every of thym heires and every of thyeir respective heires and assignes in maner & forme followinge (viz.) that the said John Andrewe at & imediately before the Sealynge & doily of this present Indenture for
and notwithstanding any detm^t or tyme whatsoev^r by him made done committed or willingly or willingly suffered to the contrary is & standeth lawfully seised of the said plotte or pell of grounde and of all & singuler other the
contingent provisoes or limitation of thye or uses power of devocation or other restraint matter or thinge whatsoever to alter change remoue make void incumbe or determine the same. and further that the said
plotte or pell of grounde and all and singuler other the þt shall or lawfully may from time to time and att all times hereafter remaine continuall and bee to and for the severall uses and upon the respective trust
trustees and thye heires without the lawfull lett suitt trouble interrupcion or disturbance of or by hym the said John Andrewe his heires or assignes or any other pson or psons lawfully claiminge or to claim any estate right
reasonable & equitie and at the prop costes and charges of them the said Hugh Lord Willoughby John Bradley Thomas Waddington Alexander Waddington John Brownlowe Richard Brownlowe James Worlsey John Dale John
and others whatsoev^r for the further and better conveyinge and dñe^r of the þt to such uses and upon such trusts and to and for such intents and purposes and under and subject to such provisoes and
agreem^t as are herein before mentioned expysed and declared of for or concerning the same accordinge to the purport true intent & meaninge of thye þt as by the said grantees or trustees herein
before named or any of thym their or any of thyeir heires or thyeir or any of thyeir heires learned in the law shall bee reasonably advised or required so as sume further obligaciones containe in them
not further or other covenants or warrantys then against him the said John Andrewe and his heires and assignes and against such pson or psons as shall lawfully claime by from & under him or them and
soe as thye pson or psons that shall bee desired and required to doe the same shall not bee compellable or compellable to travell above five miles from the place of his or thyeir abode for the doinge therof
